Our Strengths

- Our school is affiliated with the Hong Kong Baptist University, with high reputation in Hong Kong.
- Our school takes full advantage of the benefits of a DSS school which allow us to exercise flexibility in management, deployment of resources, medium of instruction, curriculum and student admission, etc.
- The members of School Management Committee share their expertise in different professions. This fosters an interchange of diversified ideas for the formulation of directions and strategies for the school's development.
- The Chief Principal and his management team have high caliber and rich experience in leading a through-train school.
- Our teaching and administrative staff are energetic, adaptable and committed to providing whole-person education.
- A professional development culture is well established, with a variety of local and overseas programmes regularly organized to enhance teachers' professional knowledge, skills and ethics.
- Local and international curricula are provided at senior grades to meet the students' diverse needs for further studies.
- The Middle School is established to strengthen support to students' intellectual, character and social developments at this particular learning stage through a wide range of tailor-made curricula and programmes.
- Students are provided with a wide array of local and overseas exposure and training to broaden their horizons, and develop them into global citizens and leaders of the future.
- Our campus is well equipped with modern facilities conducive to the school's academic, sports and aesthetic developments.

Our Weaknesses

- The school's middle management is growing, thus generating strong needs for leadership training and practice.
- Our teaching staff is relatively young, with some in need of greater support for teaching and student management.
- Teachers' turnover has been stable but still slightly higher than traditional schools, thus leading to persistent needs for orientation and team building.
- Sustained efforts are required to cater for the diverse learning needs of students of different cultural backgrounds, abilities, styles and study paths.

Our Opportunities

- The generous support from HKBU, the PTA and the Alumni Association brings in better resources while their high expectations drive the school to strive for excellence.
- With stronger collaboration and alignment between the primary and secondary divisions, students will benefit from coherent and comprehensive learning experiences on a 12-year through-train scale.
- With the implementation of the international curriculum and the third language curriculum, students will benefit from a wider range of choices for further studies.
- A broader network with overseas schools and universities brings in a wider variety of learning and life experiences for students.
- The greater intake of non-Chinese speaking students brings in more cultural and language diversities.

Our Threats

- The students' dropout rate at senior grades has been stable but still slightly higher than traditional schools due to some parents' preference for overseas education.
- The 15% quota of the Shatin intake limits the scope of student admission. The school has to face keen competition from schools in many other districts.
- Excessive involvement of some parents places unnecessary pressure on teachers.
