Liberal Arts and Liberal Studies departments launched the LA & LS Week from November 12 to 16 with the theme “Hong Kong Local Culture” to introduce the conventional surroundings from the LA & LS perspective with a series of fun-filled and inspiring activities.

The LA & LS Week was commenced with an energetic Lion Dance performance. Various activities were held during the Week, such as the Hong Kong-style milk tea demonstration, LA Knowledge Quiz Competition, Debate Competition, Crossword Puzzle Game and Book Fair. For the first time ever, SS and PS Liberal Arts Department co-organized the Middle School All Star Match to test our students’ knowledge on local culture, local history and Chinese traditional customs. Representatives of SS and PS put on a see-saw battle and PS came out better with 300-305.

Both chambers were praised by the three judges for their swift responses and extraordinary preparation. PMQ was a historical compound which was originally the Central School in the 18th Century and then rebuilt as the first Police Married Quarters in 1951. The campus underwent revitalization in 2012 and was transformed into a site for use by creative industries in 2014.

Being the first local school to organize the exhibition in the landmark of Hong Kong creative industries, the first APEX Alumni Show opened a new chapter for A-School's art talents. THE 1ST RUNNER-UP AND THE BEST FORMATION AWARD

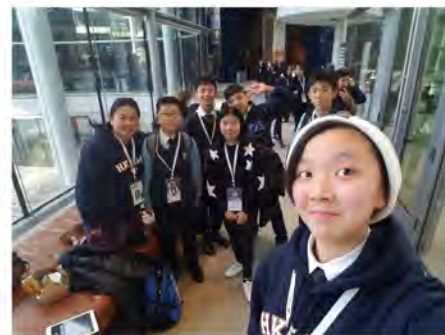

Following the good result achieved in the World Scholar's Cup - Global Round competition held in Australia in August, members of the Centre of Gifted Education qualified for the Tournament of Champions competed with the scholars from 58 countries in Yale University, USA from November 12 to 22, 2018.

After months of preparation, the team of five composed of IP Hei Yeung Ethan, KWOK Ho Wang Clement, LEUNG King Hei Lucas, LIN Wing Tung and LIU Zirui, battled against 1,200 fellow scholars from all over the world, which was the largest ever round of the tournament. With tremendous input and effort, our students received Honor medals in Team Debate and Team Bowl and obtained top hundred positions in various events. It was also our honour that Clement was appointed to be the flag bearer of Hong Kong in the closing ceremony and Wing Tung was invited to perform in the talent show.

World Scholar's Cup is an international platform of academic exchange. It attracts students of all backgrounds to discover new strengths and practise new skills with the aim to inspire future scholars and leaders. International schools in Hong Kong are not new to the competition. We are glad to send our students to new heights by taking part in the world-class event and let their talent shine through.

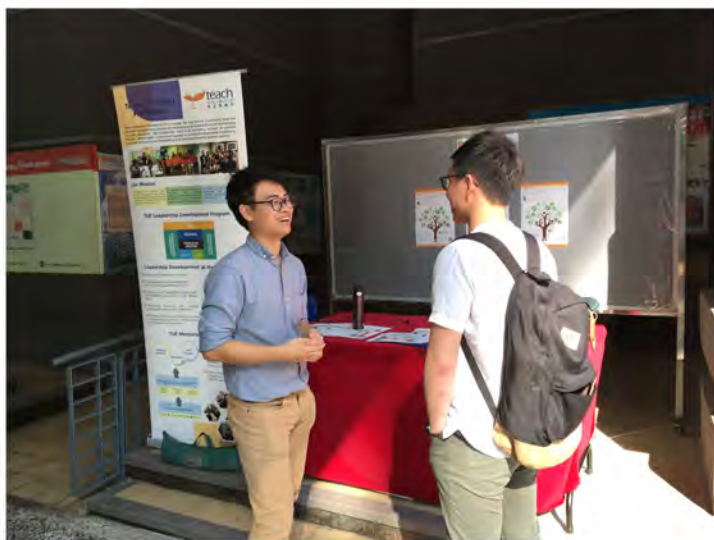

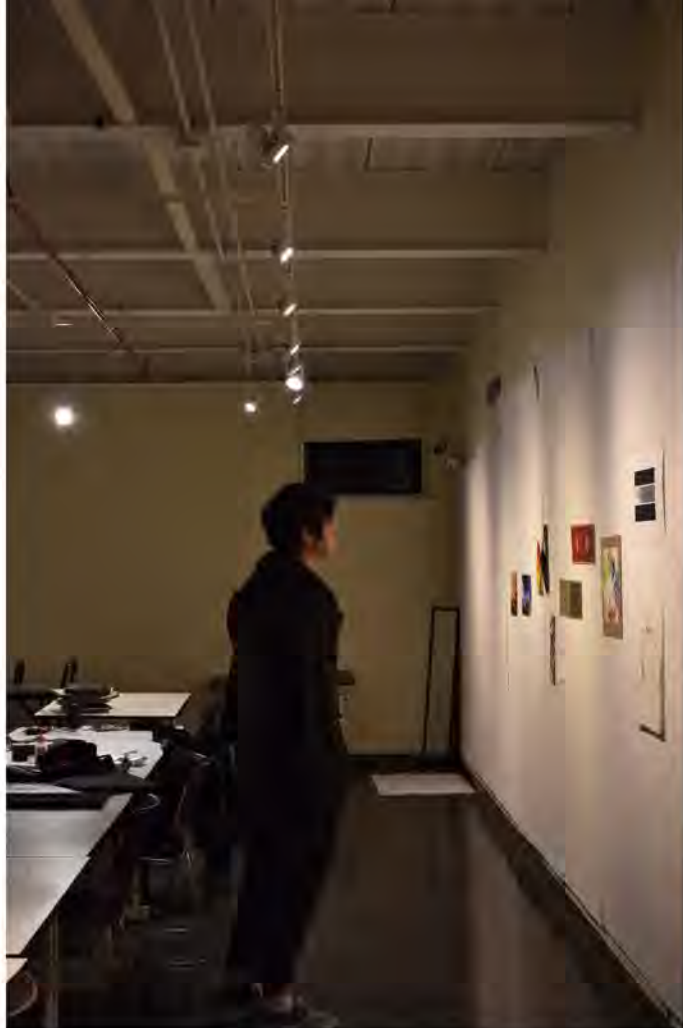

Updates on Further Studies

Updates of Alumni 2018 Further Studies



Following the remarkable HKDSE results obtained by the 2017-18 G12 students in mid-July, they, once again, made brilliant achievements in the main round offer of JUPAS. 96% of the qualified candidates received JUPAS offers, in which 80% offers were from top six universities in Hong Kong. Among them, 4% got the offer of degree programmes in medicine in the HKU and CUHK and 9% in Engineering in the HKU and HKUST.

The further study paths of the G12 students are diversified. Some of them enrolled in degree programmes at world-known universities with top QS ranking, including Lai Hiu Shan who is studying at UK's Royal College of Music which ranks as the top institution for performing arts in the UK and Europe, Jin Peihao who received scholarship from USA's Pratt Institute whose design programmes are consistently ranked among the best in the country, Kwok Tsz Him Anson is taking the aviation programme at Australia's University of New South Wales to realise his flying dream, etc. Besides, Ho Cheuk Ying who is fond of performing arts and Chinese culture is exploring Cantonese Opera skills and knowledge at the Hong Kong Academy for Performing Arts' undergraduate programme. Nominated by the principal under the High School Recommendation Admission Scheme, Yuen Pak Hin started studying a degree programme at the School of International Liberal Studies in Japan's Waseda University. A-School is the pioneer to enter partnership with this acclaimed, long-established university in Japan to launch the scheme in local secondary school. Also, VA talent Yiu Tung Ni and Cheung Kin Wang received scholarships from the prestigious Savannah College of Art and Design to pursue bachelor's degree in Illustration.

The overall further study rate achieved 98%. Congratulations to all G12 DSE students on their success and best wishes for their adventure in higher study.

GCEAL

Our first batch of international curriculum graduates attempted the 2018 GCEAL exams and achieved flying colours. Of all students, 62% obtained straight A (A*/A). With the outstanding results of 2017 GCE Advanced Subsidiary Level Examination, each student already received at least 3 conditional or unconditional offers from local and overseas top-ranking universities earlier this year. Their remarkable performance of GCEAL exam allowed them to fulfil the requirements of the offers granted by world-renowned universities.
