我如何與中醫結緣?

尤記得多年前在外地旅遊時,我因外感發熱病了好幾天,幸得團中一名中醫師通過望聞問切作出診斷及治理,短短數小時病況得以大大好轉。這次經歷給我體驗到中醫學的奇妙和治本的重要性,見識到中醫藥學 蘊含精深的學問和哲理。此外,受那位醫師的仁心所感動,我因而立志成為一名中醫師,祈能堅守仁愛之 心和應用博大精深的學問,以臨床治療,幫助有需要的人。

普羅大眾常把中醫與調理養生畫上等號,我認為這樣對中醫的描述是不完全的,除此之外,中醫更是一門 治病救人的學科。內地中醫院會把病種分為內科、皮膚科、消化系統科、腫瘤科、腎科、兒科、泌尿系統 科、內分泌及糖尿科、婦科及乳腺病科、腦內科、心血管科、老年病科、呼吸系統科、過敏性疾病科等。 而這些科室治療成功的案例多不勝數,有些甚至比西醫療效更為顯著,如三叉神經痛,腫瘤等頑疾。為病 人在求醫時提供多個選擇。

《莊子·外篇》:「物物而不物於物,則胡可得而累邪」,這句說話給我的啟發是鑽研中醫學要做到不被固有的事物或知識局限自己的想像,就如:古代臟象學說和歷代醫家甚少提及腦的疾病和概念,難道世上就沒有腦科病嗎?我們要做到汲古求新,首先就是要吸取前人正確的知識;然後放棄前人錯誤或者不合時宜的知識,在這兩者的基礎上發展出個人的見解兼且反覆求證,這是知識「提純」的過程,令到知識得以凝練,此為學習之門徑。

最後,我希望對同學說,不管你將來選擇怎樣的路,也要好好享受追求目標的過程,因為重要的往往會出現在追求想要的過程當中。感謝老師和校友會給我機會分享,能夠在此分享,我與有榮焉!

I bet a lot of you don't know but UBC actually has two campuses. One is in Vancouver, the other one is in a small town called Kelowna. And in Kelowna, I had enrolled in the Bachelor of Fine Arts program, majoring in Visual arts. I will say that the Visual Arts program there is more hands off. The workload was not as overwhelming compared to people enrolled in art school, but it certainly was not little. There are a lot of classes I am required to take. For example Art History, Creative and Critical Studies and Visual Art courses.
